**Use of Communication System to Solicit a Minor for Sexual Activity  
(18.2-374.3) – Felony Arrest**

On Wednesday, September 11, Kevin Michael Krufky, 40, of 4113 33<sup>rd</sup> Street S., Arlington, was arrested for using a communication system to solicit a minor for sexual activity, which occurred on or about August 23, 2013. Krufky solicited a Manassas teenager to participate in sexual activity. The arrest is part of an ongoing investigation of crimes reported to Manassas City Police earlier this month. Krufky was arrested with assistance of the NOVA/DC ICAC Task Force and Arlington County Police. He was held on a \$25,000 bond pending an appearance (TBD) in Prince William County Juvenile & Domestic Relations Court. A search warrant was also executed at Krufky's residence.

Manassas City Police are investigating the vandalizing of five cars parked near the intersection of Prince William Street and Main Street. Two vehicles appeared to have had their front passenger side windows shattered by a BB-gun. Three other cars appeared to have had their windows pushed open. The interiors of these vehicles appeared to have been disturbed, though nothing was reported missing.
