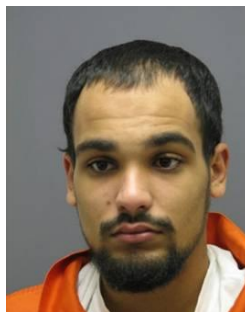
Arrest made in Burglary, Larceny & Firearms cases

The Manassas City Police Department arrested Mohamed Alaoui Sossi, 20, of Cranford, NJ, on Monday, November 19, following an investigation into several related crimes.

Mr. Sossi was charged with:

- Burglary and Grand Larceny; for entering a house on the 8500 block of Artillery Road and stealing a necklace (*see previous Crime Report, below*) on October 1.
- Reckless Handling of a Firearm and Shooting into an Occupied Dwelling; for a shot fired in a house in which he had rented a room (since August), on the 8400 block of Battle Court on November 4.
- Possession of Firearms on School Property; for hiding a bundle of guns on school property on the evening of November 4. These guns were recovered by police that night, during the investigation of the shooting incident on Battle Court. The investigation revealed that the guns were stolen from a home in Prince William County (charged by PWCPD for that burglary/larceny incident).

Mr. Sossi was held at the Adult Detention Center with no bond, pending a December 13 court appearance.

Residential Burglary

The Manassas City Police Department is investigating the burglary of a residence on the 8500 block of Artillery Road. The resident reported to police that the burglary occurred between 4:45PM and 9:30PM Monday, October 1. There were no signs of forced entry into the residence. A gold necklace was reported missing.

Stolen Automobile

The Manassas City Police Department is investigating the theft of a minivan from the 9200 block of Taney Road. The owner reported to police that the vehicle was stolen at approximately 6:20PM on Tuesday, November 27. The owner had gone outside to “warm up” the minivan. He left it unlocked and running and went back inside his residence for a few minutes. When he came back out, the vehicle was gone. The stolen vehicle is a maroon, 2000 Nissan Quest minivan.

Residential Burglary

The Manassas City Police Department is investigating the burglary of a residence on the 9300 block of Gooseberry Drive. The resident reported to police that the burglary occurred sometime between 10:00AM Friday, November 23, and 6:00PM Saturday, November 24. There were no signs of forced entry and a basement door may have been accidentally left unlocked. A video game system, electronic accessories, and several video games, were reported missing.
