Larcenies from Vehicle

Between January 10 and 17, 2014 Manassas City Police investigated the following reports of larceny from vehicles:

- 1) *Time:* Between 6:00PM and 10:30PM on January 14, 2014
Location: 10300 block of Barrington Park Cir
Details: Upon arrival, Officers discovered the driver's side door window of the reporting party's work vehicle had been shattered and a GPS unit had been stolen. Damage to the vehicle was estimated at \$200.00.

- 2) *Time:* Between midnight and 12:30PM on January 16, 2014
Location: 10200 block of Farmington Ct
Details: According to the reporting parties, someone(s) entered the vehicle while it was parked in front of their residence and stole several items, including a purse containing personal identification and credit cards, prescription medications, and a digital Nikon camera valued at approximately \$800.00.

- 3) *Time:* Between 11:00AM and 12:00PM on January 17, 2014
Location: LA Fitness located at 9946 Liberia Ave
Details: Upon arrival, Officers discovered the driver's side door window of the victim's vehicle had been broken and the victim's purse stolen. According to the victim, the purse contained nothing of significant value. Damage to the vehicle was estimated at \$300.00.

- 4) *Time:* Between 5:00PM and 6:00PM on January 17, 2014
Location: LA Fitness located at 9946 Liberia Ave
Details: Upon arrival, Officers discovered the front passenger side window had been smashed and a black purse containing personal identification and credit cards was stolen.

5) *Time:* Between 10:00PM on January 19 and 6:00AM on January 20, 2014

Location: 10200 block of Calypso Dr

Details: The victims reported two vehicles were gone through. A black leather wallet containing personal identification cards and an undisclosed amount of money was reported missing from one of the vehicles.

6) *Time:* During the overnight hours leading up to 6:00AM on January 20, 2014

Location: 9400 block of Cloverhill Ct

Details: According to the victim, someone(s) had gone through the vehicle and left the driver's side door and glove box ajar. No items were reported stolen.

Burglary

At approximately 7:45PM on January 17, 2014 Manassas City Police responded to 10200 Calypso Dr in reference to a burglary. Upon arrival, Officers met with the resident who said he had just walked out of his home and seen a subject exiting through the back door. The victim stated that his laptop had been moved by someone to the patio and a jar of coins was missing from his bedroom.

Suspect description: Male wearing a dark-colored sweatshirt, 5'-9" with a slim build

Robbery

At approximately 6:35PM on January 18, 2014 Manassas City Police responded to the intersection of Plantation Ln and Forestwood Ln for an attempted robbery. According to the reporting party, he was traveling on Plantation Ln when he discovered two male subjects attempting to remove a ladder from the top of his work van which was parked on Plantation Ln. The victim confronted the two men who insisted the victim owed them money. The suspects then implied they had a gun, threatened to return at a later time, and fled on Plantation Ln before turning south onto Sudley Rd. The victim told Officers he did not know either of the male subjects.

Description of suspects:

- 1) White male, approximately 5'-8" to 5'-11", 190 to 220 lbs with a stocky build, wearing blue jeans, an orange long sleeve zip-up sweater, and white shoes
- 2) White male, approximately 5'-5" to 5'-7", 160 to 180 lbs, wearing a black jacket and unknown color pants

Motor Vehicle Theft – Arrest

At approximately 3:25AM on January 18, 2014 Manassas City Police responded to “7-Eleven” located at 8708 Liberia Ave for a report of a motor vehicle theft in progress. According to the reporting party, one of his passengers who had been waiting for him to make a purchase inside the store had just driven off in his fiancé’s 1999 Honda Accord despite his attempts to stop her. Upon further investigation, Officers recovered the vehicle at a nearby “7-Eleven” store located at 9056 Liberia Ave. Natasha Cook, 30, of 70872 Stone Hill Ln, Manassas (20109) was arrested and charged with grand larceny and driving on a revoked license. She was held on a \$10,000.00 secured bond and a \$4,000.00 secured bond, and has a pending court date of March 4, 2014.

Robbery – Arrest

At approximately 5:55PM on January 17, 2014 Manassas City Police responded to CVS Pharmacy located at 9200 Centreville Rd for a robbery in progress. According to witness statements and footage capturing the incident, a man and a woman walked into the store at approximately 5:45PM and stood in line at the pharmacy. Shortly thereafter, the woman handed a piece of paper to staff demanding narcotics or she would begin shooting people, while the man reiterated the threat. No firearm was displayed by either subject. The pharmacist complied while another staff member dialed 9-1-1. As the individuals were exiting the store, Officers arrived and identified them as the two suspects based on the caller’s description. Melissa S. Powell, 35, of 12807 Kahns Rd, Manassas, (20112) was charged with robbery and possession of a schedule I or II controlled substance. Steven L. Farrar, 26, of 12807 Kahns Rd, Manassas (20112) was charged with robbery and transported to a local hospital for medical treatment. Each was held without bond and has a pending court date of March 4, 2014.

Aggravated Malicious Wounding – Arrest

(Originally released by Prince William County Police Department)

On January 20th at 2:21AM, Prince William County Police Officers responded to 90 Degrees Bar and Restaurant located at 8509 Rixlew Ln in Manassas (20109) to investigate a shooting. Officers arrived and located four victims suffering from gunshot wounds. All of the victims, two men and two women, were transported to area hospitals. Three of the victims were treated and released. The remaining victim, a woman, was hospitalized longer with non-life threatening injuries. The investigation into the shooting revealed that the suspect, later identified as the accused, had been removed from the bar by security shortly after 2:00AM. Once outside, the accused got into his vehicle and drove by the front of the establishment where he opened fire, striking the victims. Officers arrived at the scene quickly and were able to broadcast a description of the accused and the vehicle to adjoining agencies. A Manassas City Police Officer located the vehicle and detained the suspect following a traffic stop. Following the investigation, Jeremiah Eugene Pullen, 24, of 285 Manassas Dr in Manassas (20111) was arrested and charged with four counts of aggravated malicious wounding, four counts of using a firearm in the commission of a felony, one count of shooting into an occupied dwelling, and one count of shooting from a moving vehicle. Pullen was held without bond and has a court date of February 24, 2014.
