Larcenies from Auto, Vandalisms to Auto – Please continue reading for important tips below!

Between Dec. 17 and Dec. 22, 2016, Manassas City Police responded to several calls for reports of larcenies from auto and vandalisms to auto. In most cases, vehicles were left unlocked at the time thefts occurred, or a window was smashed in order to access something of value left in plain sight. The attached map provides a visual representation of reported larcenies that occurred between Black Friday on Nov. 25 and Dec. 21.

Larcenies from vehicle, theft of motor vehicle parts, and vandalisms to auto are the most commonly reported property offenses in the City of Manassas. During the holiday season, larcenies can easily spike if gifts and other valuables are left within plain view inside a vehicle, tempting a criminal to gain access whether by opening an unlocked door or smashing a window. To avoid becoming a victim of larceny, residents are strongly urged to consider the following tips:

1. Lock all vehicle doors and windows. (It doesn't hurt to double-check. Many victims thought they had left their vehicles locked before the theft took place. "Before you sleep, make sure it beeped!")
2. Park your vehicle in a well-lit and/or in a populous location
3. Conceal all valuables before arriving at your destination. Never underestimate the value of something to someone else. Even spare change can entice a thief to break in and steal other items once inside.
4. Report all suspicious activity by calling 703-257-8000. It never hurts to have a pen and paper ready by the phone in the event you are able to provide a description of what you saw.

Burglary

On Dec. 19, 2016, Manassas City Police met with a on the 8700 block of Barnett St for a report of a burglary. The victim told officers that sometime between 8 a.m. and 9:30 p.m., someone entered his residence and stole ammunition, a pistol, and an undisclosed amount of cash. The total value of stolen items was approximately \$600.

Larceny

On Dec. 19, 2016, Manassas City Police met with a citizen for a report of a larceny. The victim told officers that sometime between 12:10 p.m. and 4:40 p.m. that afternoon, someone stole her wallet while she was at Panera Bread, located at 9508 Liberia Ave. The victim also discovered that in a short matter of time following the theft, the suspect had made several purchases using her credit cards. Other items that were in the wallet include personal identification cards, medical information, and checks.
