Fraud

On January 31, 2018, an officer met with a complainant for a report of a fraud. The victim told police he was contacted by someone claiming to be a representative from Apple. The caller told the victim his iCloud account had been compromised and he would be sent text messages containing codes to be entered into his computer to remedy the situation. The victim entered the codes on his computer which allowed the suspect to control the computer and remove personal documents. The victim was also asked to provide a credit card number to the suspect. He complied and discovered multiple fraudulent charges were made before the victim closed the account.

Burglary **Arrest**

On January 31, 2018 at approximately 1:35 p.m., officers of the Manassas City Police Department responded to the 10000 block of 7th Regiment Dr for a report of a burglary in progress. The victim was alerted to the burglary by a notification from his in-home surveillance camera and provided officers with a description of the suspect. Responding officers located the suspect nearby and he was found to be in possession of items taken from the residence. The suspect, who was later identified as Justin MARROQUIN, a 23-year-old resident of Manassas, was subsequently arrested. The investigation revealed forced entry was made through a first floor window at the rear of the residence. Additional charges are pending in this case.

Vandalism

No items were reported missing from the vehicle.

Larceny from Motor Vehicle

On January 27, 2018 at approximately 4:22 p.m. officers met with a complainant for a report of a larceny from a motor vehicle. The victim told police his vehicle was parked in the 9600 block of Mercedes Dr. and had been broken into between 11:00 p.m. on January 26 and 7:00 a.m. on January 27. The victim reported firearms were taken from the vehicle. There were no signs of forced entry.
