January 4, 2019

Fatal Traffic Accident

On January 4, 2019, at 10:18 a.m., officers of the Manassas City Police Department responded to the intersection of Sudley Rd. and Godwin Dr. for a report of a traffic accident involving an overturned vehicle. Investigation revealed a Jeep SUV was travelling on Godwin Dr. approaching the intersection with Sudley Rd. when it collided into the rear end of a Hyundai sedan that had previously been stopped at a red light at the intersection. The initial collision between the Jeep SUV and Hyundai sedan resulted in a chain reaction causing the Hyundai sedan to be pushed into the rear end of a Toyota SUV that had also been stopped at the red light. The driver of the Jeep SUV, which became overturned as a result of the collision, was transported to INOVA Fairfax Hospital and treated and released with non-life threatening injuries. The driver of the Hyundai sedan, identified as **Erasmio RAMOS GARCIA**, a 46-year-old resident of Manassas, was transported to NOVANT Prince William Hospital where he succumbed to his injuries. The exact nature and cause of the accident remains under investigation with charges pending. Alcohol and/or drug use are not believed to be factors in the collision.

Shoplifting

On January 3, 2019, at 5:29 p.m., an officer of the Manassas City Police Department responded to the Home Depot at 8805 Liberia Ave. in reference to a report of shoplifting. A loss prevention employee of the business reported two suspects entered the store and placed a 32-gallon trash can into a shopping cart. The suspects then concealed multiple Leviton-brand ground-fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs) in the trash can and left the store without paying. The suspects were observed leaving in a white Dodge van displaying New York tag JES-5536. The suspects are believed to be involved in similar incidents at other Home Depots in the region. The total value of the items reported stolen is in excess of \$1,800. The investigation is ongoing.

Suspect Descriptions

- #1- Black male, approximately 20-25 years old, with short dark hair and beard
Last seen wearing a gray and black camouflage jacket, blue jeans, and earrings
- #2- Black male, approximately 20-25 years old, with dark hair and a mustache
Last seen wearing a gray Nike sweatshirt and sweatpants

Larceny from Vehicle

On January 3, 2019, at approximately 3:50 p.m., an officer of the Manassas City Police Department responded to the 9700 block of Sassafras Ct. for a reported larceny from vehicle. The victim reported

her vehicle had been broken into and miscellaneous items were stolen. In addition, the driver-side front tire was deflated. The larceny and suspected vandalism are believed to have occurred between 11:45 p.m. on January 2, 2019, and 12:00 p.m. on January 3, 2019, when the victim had parked their vehicle on Cloverhill Rd.

Prescription Fraud

On January 2, 2019, at 1:33 p.m., officers of the Manassas City Police Department responded to the Prosperity Pharmacy at 8644 Sudley Rd. Suite 120 for a report of prescription fraud. An employee of the business reported to police a female suspect had attempted to pass a false script to obtain prescription medication. The employee recognized the suspect because she had passed a false script at the business approximately two days prior. The suspect, identified as Lisa Kay **FITTERER**, remained at the scene and was taken into custody by officers without incident.
